As always, we will strive to create classes that are as equitable as possible in terms of class size, instructional supports, and gender. Please trust that we have your child's best interests at the heart of all of our decisions.

It is a time-honored tradition for parents to wish to advocate for their child's placement with a particular teacher. This is completely understandable; however, this has the potential for creating classrooms that are unbalanced and not necessarily in the best interests of all students.

Families have the distinct advantage of knowing their children in ways that are not always evident to school personnel, so your input is essential to this process. I encourage you to share any information you believe the school should consider as we begin the process of developing class lists. Please put your thoughts in writing and forward to me. In an effort to be more "green," please feel free to email any letters. Most specifically, your comments concerning your child's learning, social/emotional characteristics and needs will be most helpful. However, please understand that for obvious reasons it is not possible to honor specific teacher requests. **Please know this is an optional courtesy, and it is not required for you to formalize your thoughts via a letter. If you plan to send a letter, please do so by May 2, 2015.**
